 - **Skip the Contacts:** While decorative contact lenses can look spooky, they can cause serious eye injuries. It's best to avoid them unless prescribed by a doctor.

- Once you're out and about, a few key rules will keep everyone on the right path.
- **Stay Together:** Always have an adult accompany young children, and if your children are older, agree on a set route and time they must return.
 - **Stay on the Sidewalk:** Stick to well-lit streets and sidewalks. Avoid cutting across lawns or using dark alleys.
 - **Look Both Ways:** Never assume a driver sees you. Always look both ways before crossing the street, even if you see a car stopped.
 - **Light the Way:** Carry a flashlight to see clearly and make yourself more visible to drivers.

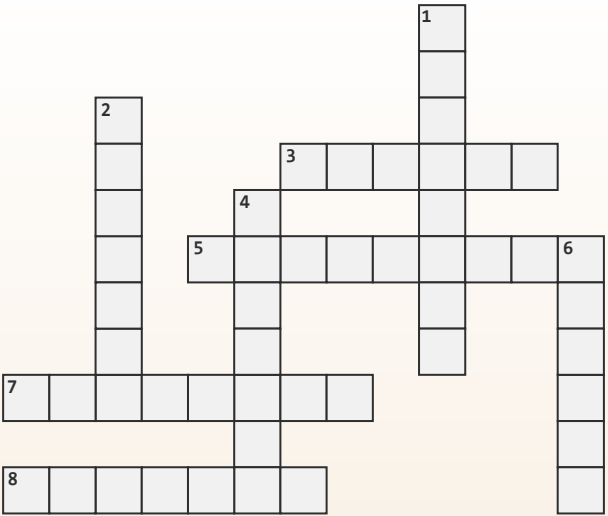
